Transitional Advocacy and Support Agreement

On 28 October, NZFSC Chair Hon Paul Swain and UFBA Chair Rick Braddock signed a Transitional Advocacy and Support Agreement in the presence of the Minister of Internal Affairs Hon Peter Dunne. The intent of this agreement is to:

- Establish a clear, certain, formal relationship between the UFBA/NZFSC that will bridge the transition period to FENZ
- Serve as a transitional agreement for the UFBA to make independent advocacy and support services available to FENZ urban and rural volunteers who are UFBA members.

The aim of this roadshow was to assist members to better understand and make sense of the potential implications of the new legislation.

We recorded a substantial amount of information at the meetings. This will reinforce the quality of the UFBA/FRFANZ contributions to the FENZ transition process.
