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### QUESTION 3

3. Oxygen therapy may be defined as the administration of supplementary oxygen to a spontaneously breathing person. It is used to assist the recovery of patients following a medical event.

a) List ten conditions where oxygen therapy should be administered to a spontaneously breathing patient. **(10 marks)**

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Oxygen resuscitation maybe defined as the administration of oxygen to a non-breathing person and is achieved by applying Intermittent Positive Pressure Ventilations (IPPV) via a soft bag and mask.
