**QUESTION 1**

**The New Zealand Fire Service National Commanders instructions state that there are control and safety measures that must be implemented when dealing with incidents that involve aircraft involved in fire.**

A. Using bullet points, list the significant hazards associated with an aircraft involved with fire.

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**QUESTION 2**

**Incidents that involve fire fighting within buildings, present significant hazards to all personnel. Using bullet points, list 10 significant hazards that may be encountered and beside each, briefly describe control measures that could be put into place to eliminate, isolate or minimise each hazard.**

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**QUESTION 3**

**The role of an interior rescuer at a motor vehicle crash is to provide safety to the patient(s) whilst being rescued.**

A. List 10 activities an interior rescuer can undertake to assist with patient safety and care during extrication.

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**QUESTION 5**

**It is the responsibility of the O.I.C. to recognise the potential hazards at a motor vehicle crash, and to provide protection for rescuers, patients and bystanders. List 10 hazards that may be encountered at a motor vehicle crash and briefly outline how each could be eliminated, isolated or minimised.**

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**QUESTION 6**

**The New Zealand Fire Service is often involved in operations that are caused by adverse weather. The National Commanders Instructions list a number of significant hazards that may be encountered and the control measures that should be undertaken to conduct these operations in a safe manner.**

A. Using bullet points, list the significant hazards that may be encountered during operations involving adverse weather.

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
