

Service Delivery Covid-19 Protection Framework (SDCPF)

This document has been based on the Government's COVID-19 Protection Framework.

Brigades must use the My Vaccine Pass to operate their canteens and hold functions on stations.

Introduction

Purpose

These protocols outline a range of measures to be adopted to minimise the current impact of Covid-19 on our people to enable us to maintain our capability and provide our services across the country.

The purpose of this protection framework is to reduce risk to Fire and Emergency personnel based on the New Zealand Government declared COVID-19 Protection Framework and associated legislative measures.

How to use

Districts are expected to develop local procedures based on these protocols. Highlighted text indicates changes since the last version of this document.

- Vaccine passes are required to access all Fire and Emergency New Zealand premises.
- Fire and Emergency New Zealand personnel do not need to show a My-Vaccine-Pass

Omicron variant guidance

The impact of the Omicron variant on Fire and Emergency services, internationally, has been severe.

To protect ourselves, our Whanau and our communities, as well as our ability to safely operate, will see us needing to be agile and continually adapt to the situation as it unfolds

Mask guidance

Surgical mask is the minimum protection level, N95 is the gold standard.

Due to supply constraints, N95 only for medical calls and MIQs

Personnel covered by the health order must not wear a cloth mask while operating in their role.
