





How it began...

In the 1980's, volunteer fire brigades throughout New Zealand were concerned that when a firefighter was injured while carrying out their duties, any time off their normal work resulted in a considerable loss, as ACC paid only 80% of an injured person's income. This resulted in some volunteer firefighters suffering hardship, due to an injury sustained while serving their community.

It all came to a head when a Waiuku volunteer firefighter was accidentally hit by another firefighter's vehicle while responding to a fire call. The injured firefighter was off work for a long period of time. He was self-employed and drawing a minimal wage, with most of his income being retained to build up his business. As ACC only paid 80% of declared income, he and his family were severely disadvantaged.

The UFBA Executive had been considering ways to help firefighters in situations of hardship and the Waiuku incident gave impetus to establishing the UFBA Benevolent Fund. The proposal was well supported when put to the Annual Conference under Neville Twort's presidency, with the annual levy per brigade member to be the equivalent to the cost of one jug of beer.

I had the privilege of being appointed the inaugural Chairman of the Benevolent Fund and held that role until required to relinquish it on my appointment to the NZ Fire Commission in 1993.

WHAT DO WE HELP WITH?

Examples of where the Fund can help are:

- Funds for travel or accommodation for family members following a severe injury or illness
- Provision of grocery vouchers to ensure there is food on the table for families facing expected job losses
- Accommodation, food and clothing needed immediately after a fire, flood or earthquake



HOW TO MAKE AN APPLICATION

Applications are made on the application form - ufba.org.nz/advocacy-and-support/benevolentfund

We cannot accept applications from intended recipients. All applications must be signed by the Chief Fire Officer or Officer-in-Charge.

POINTS TO CONSIDER

- The Fund does not accept applications from possible recipients.
- The Fund does not accept applications that are retrospective, nor retrospectively for an event that has already taken place.
- The process can happen in as little as one working day where there is an extreme need.
- In the application, be clear around what has happened and the financial challenges that are being faced e.g. expenses associated with serious illness. Does the brigade member have the financial resources to cope with what has happened? Is there any other assistance

available? e.g. from government departments, insurance policies, savings etc. The level of support given will vary depending on the circumstances.

- The Secretary may ask for more details before circulating the application to the Benevolent Fund Trustees for consideration.
- The Trustees forward their recommendations to the Chairman of the Benevolent Fund who makes the final decision.
- The Secretary will let the OIC/CFO know the outcome of their application.
- Approved payments are made directly to the family. The Benevolent Fund does not give to fundraising websites such as Givealittle.

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the UFBA Benevolent Fund for the support recently provided to one of our firefighters here in Rotorua.




This generosity is a powerful reminder of the care and solidarity that exists within our fire service community.

On behalf of my wife and myself I would like to thank the UFBA for the funds which were given to us in a very tough time in our lives. Words can't explain how much it helped us out financially and definitely removed the stress of money from our situation.

In October 2024 we had our second son. Along with being born seven weeks early, he had some serious health issues that would require surgery once he was strong enough. He was incubated in the NICU for the first weeks until he was able to breathe on his own and get stronger. With this being the case, I was off work for quite a long time, going between the hospital and back home for our other son who was five years old.

A few weeks later we all made it back home, and then faced a very tough few months of back and forth to hospital for health issues. By this time I had used all my leave from work and we were starting to stress financially. We finally got a date for his surgery, which would require us to fly to Christchurch for it to be carried out, and more time off work and time away from our five-year-old, so there was definitely a lot of worry and stress for us. The money that was given to us by the UFBA helped us out so much in this time and allowed us to not have to worry about expenses with our travelling and loss of income. It made a massive difference in our lives.

Dear Jane and Trustees,

Lynn and I would like to express our profound gratitude for the kind financial support following my accident and hospitalisation at a fire callout. I am sorry that it has taken this time to contact you. My mind and body have been trying hard to get back to what they were and I have been somewhat distracted. The language of my ancestors references "Ceud mile taing" or one hundred thousand thanks, and this is an eloquent way of reflecting how we feel about your speedy and positive assistance.

I have guided the rescue helicopter to incidents on many occasions but never considered that one day I would be that incident, on 18th December! The paramedics and Hato Hone were superb but so too were the team members from Twizel Brigade. They used their CPR skills to keep me alive and be in a state to be moved and transferred. I have much pride in being a firefighter for my community but this pride is amplified when thinking of them and Twizel Volunteer Fire Brigade led by Simon Fox, with Paul Tilsley and Rob Hands showing leadership and concern. I am proud also of the support UFBA provides for firefighters.

My health is improving each day and I am supported by the Brigade and my wife (who visited me three times each day in Dunedin Hospital and Te Puawai). Your support has greatly helped to alleviate the financial pressures from transport and accommodation costs to attend assessments outside of Twizel. The next two months will include cognitive and physical tests in Dunedin to ensure that I can retrieve my driving licences and be allowed back into my FENZ work. Stress of any description would have had a negative impact on my rehabilitation from what was classed as a traumatic brain injury.

I am so pleased to reiterate that my physical and mind health have improved dramatically and you as UFBA trustees have been real contributors to this.
